



Single Use Plastic :

What you need to know about the upcoming Federal ban

Dear partner,

The federal government has recently published a document reviewing the technical guideline concerning the upcoming single use plastic ban. Six products categories are included in this ruling: Plastic Bags, Plastic utensils, six-pack rings, steering sticks, straws and some specific types of food packaging.

Section B.3 highlights the details on plastic food packaging which are covered in this ban (B.3.1) by definition, and those who are NOT COVERED (B.3.2) by the ruling.

Furthermore, we are happy to inform you that no items in Tilton's portfolio is part of the upcoming plastic ban.

B.3.2 Plastic foodservice ware not prohibited by the Regulations

The following plastic foodservice ware are excluded from the definition of SUP foodservice ware and are not impacted by the Regulations as long as they are not used to primarily serve and transport food or beverage that is ready to be consumed;



Awave & Forno

- *Plastic food containers used to package products that must be prepared before being reheated for consumption (oven cooking, microwave).*
- *Even if they happen to contain some black carbon, containers made with PP and CPET from Tilton are not banned because they do not check all 3 criteria (usage, content & shape).*

Repost

- *Clamshell containers, containers with lids, boxes, drinking cups, plates or bowls made with easily recyclable plastic are not banned. This applies to RPET.*

Biogo

- *Clamshell containers, containers with lids, boxes, drinking cups, plates or bowls made with non conventional or compostable material. This applies to PLA.*
